STABLES, VEHICLE & CARAVAN PARKING

1. Stables

Stables should be reserved at time of entry on payment of the fee below. This entitles the competitor to the use of a stable from 17.30hrs on the night of reservation until 17.00hrs on the following night.

All Stables: £42.00 (inc VAT) per stable per night including bedding.

Straw will not be allowed in the stables area.

We will provide a base bed in all stables, if you wish to bring your own additional shavings please do so, alternatively competitors will be able to buy bedding at excellent rates on a cash and carry bases from the Stable Managers office.

All stables **MUST** be cleaned out by 17.00 hrs each day. When there is a changeover in stables a £25 deposit will be required. This will be returned providing the stable is left in a clean state on departure.

Hessian drop sheeting will not be provided.

In the interests of safety **NO portable cookers** will be permitted in the stables.

2. Horse Transport/Lorries

Vehicles may park **FREE OF CHARGE** in the designated vehicle park in the equine area situated north of the Showground. Follow traffic management signs to this destination.

In the interests of safety **NO portable cookers** will be permitted in the lorry parks.

3. Staying Overnight

Lorries staying overnight will be parked in a separate area to the day-only lorries.

4. Caravans

Caravan space is available at the Festival please contact Stoneleigh Lodge on 02476 69 0123. **NO** caravans will be allowed in the Lorry Park. All fuels must be securely stored in the correct containers. Generators will be refused if they are not in a suitable condition.

5. Cars

PRIVATE CARS WILL NOT BE ADMITTED ONTO THE SHOWGROUND. They will be accommodated in Car Park 3. Admission to the car parks will be free of charge. **NO CARAVANS OR CAMPING VEHICLES WILL BE ALLOWED IN ANY CAR PARK.**

6. Fire Extinguishers

All vehicles being used for overnight accommodation must carry fire extinguishers.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Admission to the Festival

Documents relating to exhibits, including admission tickets, will be forwarded approximately 14 days before the opening of the Festival.

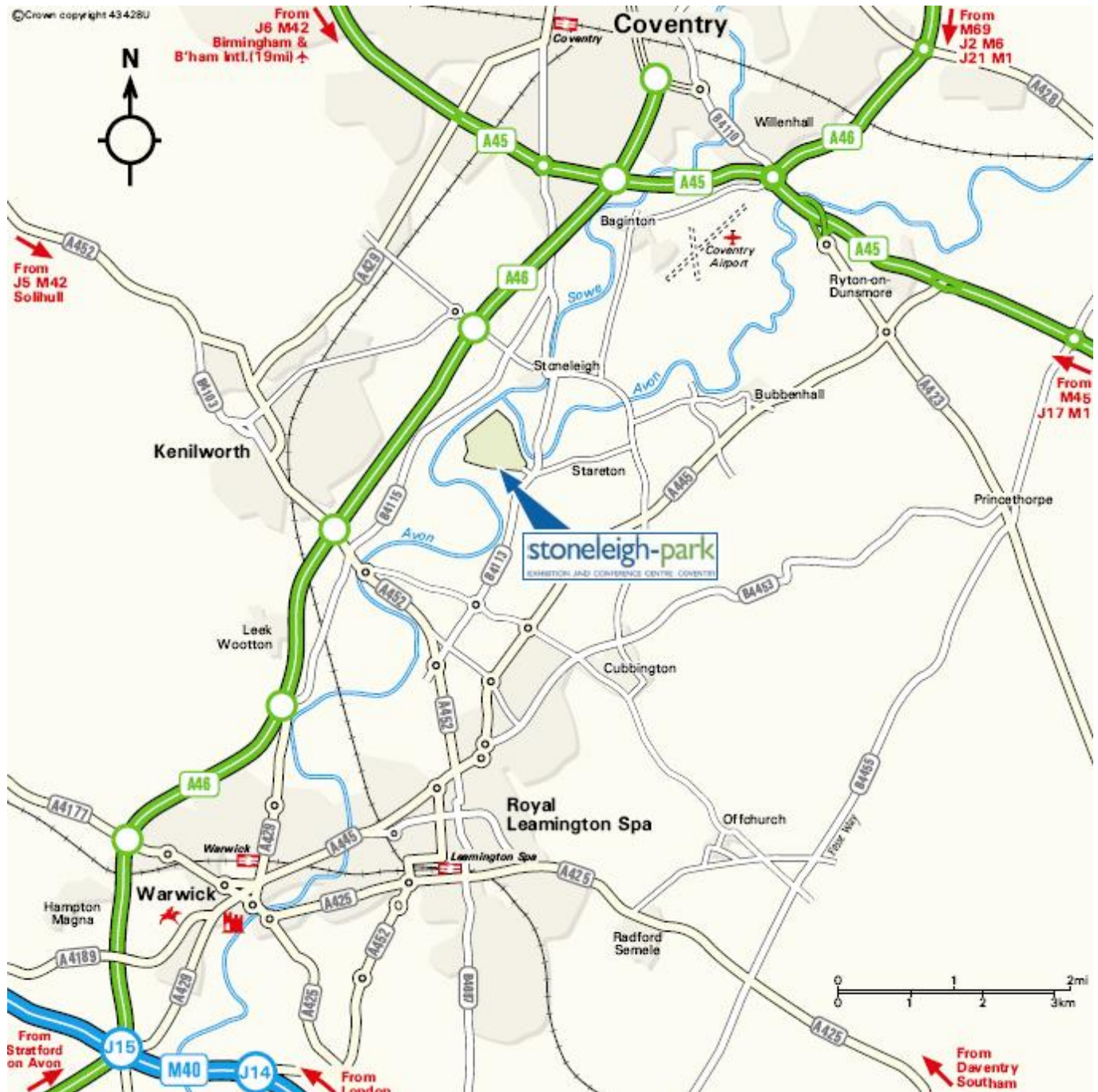
4. Fodder

STONELEIGH PARK

How to find us:

The Festival of the Horse is based at Stoneleigh Park, which is readily accessible from most parts of the country. It is very close to the main motorway network, with the M1, M40, M42, M45, M6, M69 all nearby; Coventry inter-city rail service is only 10 minutes away; Coventry Airport is only 5 minutes away at Baginton; while Birmingham Airport with its domestic and international flight schedules is 20 minutes away. Stoneleigh Park and Stoneleigh are signposted on the main roads into the Showground, i.e. the A46, B4113, A452 and A45. **All horseboxes will access the site via Gate 3 off the B4115.**

Foals must be by a RID sire, registered or over stamped by the IDHS (GB) and standing in Great Britain at time of covering. If one or both have already qualified, the mare(s) next in line will go forward to the final at the IDHS (GB) Annual Breed Show (*date and venue to be announced*). The awards are: Champion, the New Snowford (GB) Breeding trophy, a sash, a rosette and £100, Reserve Champion: a sash, a rosette and £50. Places 3rd to 7th: a rosette and £20. All prize winners will receive a Crystal trophy. All other finalists will receive a rosette. In the final, the mare and her foal will be judged as a pair.

Class 144.03 is a qualifier for the NFU Mutual Irish Draught Youngstock Challenge. REGULATIONS APPLYING TO HORSES & PONIES AT THE ROYAL FESTIVAL OF THE HORSE

Definitions

“the Event Organisers” – Royal Agricultural Society of England (RASE) or Express Equine Events E3

1. Competitor’s Risk and Responsibility

Neither the Event Organiser nor any of its Officers or Servants shall be in anyway responsible or accountable for anything that may happen (from any cause or circumstances whatever) to competitors of their servants, or agents, or to any exhibit, or any vehicle conveying any exhibit, or any crate, package, show-case or other article or thing containing or relating to any exhibit, or any other property brought into the Showground or for anything else in connection with, or arising out of, or attributable to, the Event Organisers’ show.

EACH COMPETITOR SHALL BE SOLELY RESPONSIBLE for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to or occasioned by, or arising from any animal or article exhibited by him, and for its description as given in the catalogue, and shall indemnify the Event Organisers against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto. Each competitor of livestock shall be responsible for payment to the Event Organisers for costs incurred as and for liquidated damages for any animal sent for exhibition which has to be placed in isolation because it is showing signs or symptoms of contagious or infectious disease, or any form of disease likely to prove dangerous to other animals. Competitors shall be responsible for the behaviour of their servants or agents and for the consequences of any misconduct of such servants or agents. Any fine imposed upon a Competitor, or a person employed by him, for infringing the regulations or disobedience to the order of the Stewards, shall be recoverable from the competitor as a debt to the Event Organisers, and until such payment shall debar such competitor from exhibiting at any future show of the Event Organiser.

Competitors should be satisfied in all cases that the correct and appropriate restraining method and equipment is provided for use by animal handlers. All Light Horse Colts 2 years and over must be shown in a bridle and bit. Competitors in the Private Driving classes should ensure that they are adequately covered by third-party insurance. Horse Passports: competitors must ensure that they comply with the requirements of national legislation in force at the time of the Show.

2. Animal Health Act

Animals which are subject to restrictions under the Animal Health Act 1981 (as amended) or the Animal and Animal Products (import and Export) (England and Wales) Regulations 2000 (as amended) will not be allowed onto the Showground.

3. Application for Entry Forms

4. Closing Date for Entries

All entries will be online, any paper entries will incur an administration charge of £5 per competitor and must be paid to the Equine Office, RASE, Stoneleigh Park, Warwickshire CV8 2LZ, on or before the date appointed for the closing of entries, as set out within this schedule. Only entries properly completed and with the correct entry fee will be accepted.

Late entries will be at the discretion of the organisers and may not be accepted

5. Ownership of Exhibits

Every animal at the Festival must be exhibited in the name of the owner who entered it. If a horse changes ownership after the closing date of entries, it can be exhibited in the name of the new owner, provided it is re-registered with the relevant society/body/organisation before the catalogue is printed. In the case of conflict between the rules of the society/organisation/body under which the classes run, the society/organisation/body rules will prevail. No substitution of horses will be permitted after the closing date of entries.

6. Completion of Entry Forms

Every competitor shall be held responsible for the correctness of his/her entry. If, when called upon to prove its correctness, he/she fails to do so, the entry in question shall not be accepted. If it shall be proved to the satisfaction of the Event Organiser, whose decision shall be final, that a competitor or competitor has knowingly signed an incorrect certificate, or has attempted to obtain a prize by any means deemed by the Event Organiser to be unfair, all awards made to such competitor in any class may be cancelled, and he/she may be disqualified from competing at future shows of the Event Organiser. A horse or pony bred by a stallion owned by the judge or a mare which visited his/her stud purely for the purpose of covering shall be exempt from this exclusion.

8. Substitution of Judges

The Event Organiser reserves the right to substitute other Judges for those named in the Schedule or make additional appointments. Where time permits competitors will be informed of the change via the website www.festivalofthehorse.co.uk.

9. Cancellation of Entries/Amalgamation of Classes

The Event Organiser, in its absolute discretion, may refuse an entry or cancel any entry already accepted, at the expense and risk of the competitor, for any exhibit already delivered.

Fees for incorrectly entered classes will be refunded **less an administration charge of £5**

Fees for falsely made entries will not be refunded.

Fees for oversubscribed classes will be refunded in full.

10. Adjustment of Entries

The Organisers reserve the right to adjust the number of entries per competitor in relation to accommodation available.

11. Exclusion from Exhibiting

No person who shall have been shown to the satisfaction of the Event Organiser properly to have been excluded for prizes at shows, sales or exhibitions of any other Breed or Agricultural Society, Association or Club, and no person who is under exclusion or suspension from any Breed or Agricultural Society, Association or Club shall be allowed to exhibit at this or any other Show of the Event Organiser.

12. Incivility and Expulsions from Showground

Any act of discourtesy to any judge, steward, event official or event organiser on the part of the competitor, groom, rider, driver or agent of an animal, will, at the discretion of such official disqualify that animal from being judged, in which case entry fees, prizes and charges will be forfeited.

The Event Organiser shall have the power to remove from the Showground the animals or property belonging to any competitor who shall infringe any of the regulations or conditions of the Show, or who shall refuse to comply with any instructions given by the Stewards.

13. Age of Exhibits

In stating the age of a horse or pony it is only necessary to give the year in which it was born, except in the case of yearlings and foals, when the exact date of birth must be given. The name of the sire of the foal must also be stated on the entry form. Foals must be at least 3 weeks old at date of Event.

14. Mare with Foal at Foot

All foals must be the offspring of the mares with which they are exhibited, and must accompany their dams in the judging ring.

15. Height of Exhibits

Animals entered in classes with conditions as to height (except those for which an official height certificate has been issued by the Joint Measurement Board Ltd or by an equivalent body in a Member State), may be measured with their shoes on, at the request of the Judge or the Steward. One centimetre will be allowed for the shoes. Young Stock, Show Hacks and Ponies entered in the Riding Pony Breeding Young Stock classes will be measured in the Measuring Box provided in the Horse Lines.

Life Certificates: Where a life certificate or a Valid Annual Certificate has been issued by the Joint Measurement Board for an animal this must be produced for inspection by the Veterinary Officer in charge of measuring, otherwise the animal concerned will be measured. Competitors will be given a measuring slip as proof that the certificate has been checked which must be handed to the Steward in charge at the ringside in order for the animal to gain entry to its class.

No animal will be allowed to compete in its class unless the appropriate measuring slip is produced at the ringside.

16. Transfers

The Judge will transfer any horse in a Light or Middle-weight class to a heavier weight class, if he/she considers that the horse exceeds the specified weight.

Transfers in height-restricted classes will not be allowed other than in the In-hand Hacks & Riding Horses and Riding Pony Breeding Young Stock classes, where the NPS Measurement Scheme will apply.

17. Dress – Handlers

Grooms/attendants appearing with animals in judging rings MUST be of smart appearance and in proper dress code (not jeans), with appropriate headwear.

18. Leaders

The leader who enters the ring with the horse/pony must remain with the animal throughout the class. Only in special circumstances with the permission of the judge may another person trot it out.

Fees

19. Fees

Fees (including stabling charges) for all horses/ponies and vehicle parking arrangements and charges are as stated on Page 2. Entry fees shall be paid by Credit Card/Mastercard/VISA online, or by BACS method as follows:

20. Return of Fees

Entry fees are NOT returnable, except under Regulation 9, or otherwise as directed by the Event Organiser, in respect of individual animals which are withdrawn before the Festival or are not forward at the Festival even though a Veterinary Certificate is produced to account for the withdrawal or absence of such entry.

In the event of horses/ponies not being allowed to travel to the Festival because they are from a Movement Prohibited Area, the entry fees in respect of such exhibits will be refunded.

Admission

21. Arrival and Departure

Notification of arrival times will be confirmed with the Festival documents.

The Equine Gate (Gate 3) will be open during the following times for admission to the Showground:

Thursday 8 th July	1200 – 2200
Friday 9 th July	0600 – 2200
Saturday 10 th July	0600 – 2200
Sunday 11 th July	0600 – 2200

22. Admission Passes

Admission passes will be allocated as follows: Three wristbands per horse, valid only on the day on which the entered class takes place. (NB. Passes will only be allocated for foals if entered separately in a foal class).

Competitors may purchase additional wristbands at the rate of £20 each inc. VAT. No refunds will be given on wristbands purchased.

Competitors may be fined up to £50 in each case of transfer, or other improper use of any badge/ticket/wristband. In addition any competitor infringing this regulation may risk expulsion from the Showground for this and subsequent events.

General

23. Decoration of Exhibits

No animal shall be decorated with colours other than the Society's or Breed Societies' prize rosettes won at the current Festival.

24. Display of Names During Judging

Competitors are prohibited from displaying the sponsor's name (other than the current Festival's sponsor of the section, then only as authorised by the Event Organiser) in any form whilst the animals are being judged.

25. Exhibiting/Parading of Horses/Ponies

All persons in charge of exhibits shall be subject to the orders of the Head Steward and Stewards and shall be required to parade or exhibit the animals in their charge at such times as may be directed, otherwise any prize awarded to such exhibits will be withheld. It shall be the sole responsibility for all competitors to make prior arrangements for the leading of the exhibits. Smoking by persons in charge of animals during judging or during parades/displays is strictly prohibited.

26. Mobile Phones

The use of mobile phones in the judging rings is prohibited.

27. Removal of Manure

All stables **MUST** be cleaned out daily. There will be designated areas for collection of muck from stables.

Prizes and Trophies

28. Prizes Offered

See respective breed classification for value of prizes offered.

29. Withholding Prizes

A judge may withhold any prize or prizes if, in his/her opinion, an exhibit is of insufficient merit.

30. Championship Prizes

First and Second prize winners must, where eligible, compete for the championship prizes, or they will be liable to the forfeiture of their class prizes.

31. Forfeiture of Prizes

The Head Steward, on report of a Steward, shall have power on the infringement of any of these or other prescribed regulations or conditions, to subject the competitor to a fine of £35, and to the forfeiture of any prize to which he/she may be entitled (in addition to all other consequences attaching to such infringement).

32. Despatch of Trophies and Prize Money

Winners of RASE trophies must present their trophy form to the Organisers' Office in order to collect the trophy before leaving the Showground. In certain instances the Event Organiser does, however, reserve the right, at its discretion, to withhold certain trophies from being taken from the Showground. Cheques for the prizes awarded at the Festival will be sent by post to the person at the address specified on the entry form after the Festival. Any outstanding accounts due to the Society will be set-off against any prize money or other amount owed to the competitor.

Health & Safety

33. Health and Safety Regulations at Equine Shows

In accordance with the Health & Safety legislation all equestrian competitors/owners/grooms must now comply with the rules and regulation stated within this showing schedule.

Horse walks have been laid out by the Event Organiser and ridden, driven and in-hand horses must be kept within these designated routes and take guidance from Officials or Stewards at crossing points etc.

Total separation of horses and the general public may not always be possible and if a competitor has a nervous or highly strung animal he should consider whether it is prudent for him to risk bringing this animal to a busy equine event.

Competitors are reminded that the Festival environment can be upsetting for horses and ponies, even those of normally placid temperament. Horses and ponies with an unstable or aggressive temperament must not be brought to the showground. When, in the opinion of the Event's Officers, the Police, the Health and Safety Executive or other competent authority an animal's behaviour poses an immediate threat to life and limb of people in its immediate vicinity the Event Organiser reserves the right to instruct an authorised person to mitigate such threat in such manner as shall to that authorised person seem appropriate, not excluding the humane destruction of the said animal and by exhibiting at the Festival of the Horse, competitors are deemed to authorise such person or persons to so act. Competitors by exhibiting at the Festival of the Horse acknowledge and agree that the Event Organiser, its employees, servants and agents shall not be liable for any such matters as are referred to in this Regulation and in particular but not be way of limitation that the Event Organiser shall not be liable for any loss or damage (whether direct or indirect or consequential) suffered as a consequence of the Event Organiser instructing such persons as are referred to above. Further, each competitor by exhibiting at the Festival of the Horse hereby indemnifies and agrees to indemnify the Event Organiser, its Officers, Agents and Employees from and against any and all liability, claims and costs which result there from.

34. Leading Horses (including Mares and Foals)

No person may lead more than one animal when moving to and from the rings.

35. Hard Hats

It is the sole responsibility of riders to ensure that at all times while on horseback, they wear correctly fitted protective headgear which complies with BS EN1384 and PAS015 and chin straps must be securely fastened. The Company accepts no responsibility for any injury arising from a failure to comply with this regulation.

36. Lunging Animals

Lunging of animals is not permitted in the collecting rings.

Health and Welfare of Animals

37. Welfare

No person shall cause or permit the transport of an animal that is unfit by reason of it being in the state of being newborn, diseased, infirm, ill, injured or fatigued or having given birth within the preceding 48 hours or likely to give birth during transport or for any other reason, in compliance with The Welfare of Animals During Transport Order 1997 or any legislation in force at the time.

38. Welfare of Animals During Transport

The new legislation, which came into force in January 2007, brings in new rules covering the movement of animals. If you move horses as part of your business activities then you will be affected. Under the new rules everyone transporting animals commercially must comply. Please see www.defra.gov.uk for further details.

39. Certification of Health (Importing/Exporting)

Horses and Ponies sent direct from other Member States must be accompanied by Certification of Health in accordance with the appropriate Trade Directive for the species, including additional certification granted to the UK under Community provisions.

Animals and Animal Products (Import & Export) (England and Wales) Regulations 2000 (as amended). Animals may be sent directly to Stoneleigh Park but RASE may not be listed as the consignee. It is the responsibility of the importer to notify the Animal Health Office (West Midlands) Tel 01785 231900 at least 24 hours prior to arrival that they are bringing animals to the Event and detailing the name of consignee.

It is the sole responsibility of the competitor to ensure that the animal/s will be eligible to return to their Member State and are accompanied by the appropriate return certification. It is the responsibility of the competitor to notify the Divisional Veterinary Manager of their requirements for return certification.

40. Veterinary Inspection

The Veterinary Inspectors of the Event Organiser will carry out spot checks throughout the Event of horses/ponies. Those animals originating directly from another Member State will be checked as required by the provision of Chapter 2 of the Council Directive 90/425/EEC.

All health documentation must be presented and animal/s adequately identifiable.

The Society's Inspectors or those appointed by DEFRA are authorised to exclude or place in isolation any animals which, in their opinion, are exhibiting any symptoms of contagious or infectious disease, or any other condition which they consider warrants its exclusion or whose identity cannot be adequately established. In such an event a certificate recording the findings of the Inspector shall be handed to the person in charge of the rejected animal. Each owner of horses and ponies shall be responsible for payment to the Event Organiser for costs incurred as and for liquidated damages for any animal sent for exhibition which has to be placed in isolation because it is showing signs or symptoms of contagious or infectious disease, or any form of disease likely to prove dangerous to other animals. Competitors are responsible for ensuring in the event of the area from which entries are to be conveyed to the Festival being declared a Movement Prohibited Area that such entries are not sent for exhibition.

41. Veterinary Emergency Treatment

It is a condition of entry that the Society's Veterinary Officers may on their own authority give to any animal such emergency treatment as they may consider appropriate in the event that the owner or his/her representative cannot immediately be found.

42. Veterinary Charges

Veterinary charges incurred by anyone at the Festival must be settled directly with the Veterinary Surgeon. The Organisers take no responsibility for any Veterinary fees due.

43. Soundness and Freedom from Hereditary Disease

In all classes animals must be free from clinical signs of disease, injury, or physical abnormality, such as would affect the animal's usefulness for breeding purposes. No veterinary inspection will be required, except when considered necessary by the judges, or on a protest being lodged.

44. Equine 'Flu

After a reassessment it is no longer a requirement for horses competing at the Festival to be vaccinated for equine influenza, although the organisers strongly recommend all horses are vaccinated.

The decision to relax the rules has been taken for 2010 because the Festival is not hosting any international level competitions in its first year.

45. Equine Viral Arteritis

Owners of stallions will be required to sign a declaration, incorporated in the Entry Form confirming that they have implemented the common codes of practice for control of EVA advised by the Horserace Betting Levy Board, or equivalent safeguards from those countries where the common code of practice is not operational. Animals listed under EVA Order 1995 will not be allowed onto Stoneleigh Park.

46. Drug Administration

Antibiotics, inhibitory substances, and other prescriptions only medicines are banned at the Festival of the Horse unless they are administered under the supervision of the Festival Veterinary Surgeons.

The Society prohibits the administration to Show exhibits (entered either for competition or sale/demonstration) of tranquillisers or other drugs which may in any way affect the performance of the animal in question or have the effect

of making it behave in the Show ring in a manner which is not natural. The Event Organiser reserves the right to drug test any exhibit on the RASE's premises and/or to take blood/urine samples from any such Exhibit. Any competitor (or his/her representative) who is found to have administered or permitted the administration of any such tranquillisers or drugs to a Show exhibit will be dealt with the Event Organiser's discretion. In addition the matter will be referred to the appropriate Breed Society or Organisation.

The presence in any form or quantity, in a horse being shown, of a substance which could, by its nature, affect its performance, is forbidden.

The Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain and Judges appointed by it, may cause tests to be carried out at any affiliated show, or otherwise to determine whether this condition has been breached, the findings whereof shall be forwarded to the Rules Committee for further consideration.

Any pony taking part in any classes judged under BPS Rules will be liable to sampling, as may be any other animal at the request of the Breed Society.

47. Infectious Diseases

Every competitor must sign in a declaration prior to the entry of any equine to Stoneleigh Park stating that, 'All horses and ponies (including donkeys and mules) that are coming onto Stoneleigh Park have not shown any symptoms of strangles or ringworm, or have been in contact with any horses or ponies (including donkeys and mules) which have shown symptoms of strangles or ringworm or been in contact with premises where there has been equines infected with strangles or ringworm within 21 days prior to entry to Stoneleigh Park'. This declaration is part of the Equine entry form.

RASE Competitor's Privacy Policy

The Royal Agricultural Society of England and Express Equine Events (E3) respects the privacy of its competitors and in accordance with the Data Protection Act 1988 is committed to protecting your privacy and respecting the privacy of others.

The RASE, E3 and its wholly owned company Stoneleigh Park Ltd will use your information together with other information for administering your remittance and animal entry forms, as well as for marketing, customer services and profiling your entries. We will disclose your interest to other departments within our group who will then use your contact details to keep you informed of future events we believe may be of interest to you. Your details will be used to compile our Equine Catalogue, and those competitors who receive an award will have their name and county posted on our website and their name and address details made available to the national press.

We will retain your personal details for at least 3 years from your last entry to enable us to process your details more efficiently should you enter again.

You have a right to ask for a copy of your information (for which we charge £10.00) and to ask us to correct any inaccuracies. INTERPRETATION CLAUSE

The Royal Agricultural Society of England and Express Equine Events (E3) reserves to itself by its Council the sole and absolute right to interpret these or any other prescribed conditions and regulations, or Schedules, and to settle and determine all matters, questions, or differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of or connected with or incident to the Show and exhibiting at the Festival of the Horse shall constitute a proof of an undertaking by the competitor to be bound by the decision of the RASE and E3 in the interpretation and application of these Regulations.

PROTESTS

Any competitor, breeder, or member wishing to lodge a protest having reference to equines exhibited at the Festival of the Horse shall do so on an official printed Objection form for the purpose, obtainable from the Organisers' Office, and shall deposit with the Equine Office the sum of £65. This protest must be made within 1 hour of the result being announced in the Arena and will be put before an appeal committee whose decision will be final.

If the objection is determined against the objector then the deposit will be forfeited unless in the opinion of the Appeal committee there were good and reasonable grounds for the objection, when they may order to the contrary. If the objection is upheld then the deposit will be refunded in full.

All competitors and persons admitted onto the Showground shall be subject to the Rules, Orders and Regulations of the Council.
